

WASTE PLAN FOR THE PARKS

Lower Makefield Township Adopts A Pathway to Zero Waste Plan for the Parks



Lower Makefield Township Parks and Recreation Pathway to Zero Waste Lower Makefield Township Parks will look different in 2023 as the Township BOS, Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and the Environmental Advisory Council support a new initiative called the Pathway to Zero Waste.

The Plan will allow

Lower Makefield Township Parks and Recreation Department to promote environmental sustainability throughout the Township. The Department along with the Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) developed this plan to better use our public land and resources while eliminating as much waste from our landfills as possible.

The intent of the plan is to empower park users to participate in social responsibility through personal waste reduction, provide a schedule for taking the steps necessary to achieve compliance, and provide opportunities for reallocation of Township resources.

Park users will be encouraged through signage to be responsible for any waste they bring into the facility. Most parks will go to a strictly carry in - carry out model meaning that waste receptacles will be removed from the facility. Park users will instead remove their personal waste and be encouraged to practice recycling in their everyday lives.

This program will not only be environmentally responsible, but it will also allow the Department to reallocate staff resources towards other projects. While this is feasible in most facilities, the Parks and Recreation Department recognizes that each site has unique features and users which may make a total removal of receptacles inconvenient. The Parks and Recreation Department has identified specific sites which will move to a reduction in waste receptacles. It is also important to note that long term goals may evolve with time in order to make a larger impact on waste reduction within the parks.

"We are proud to be one of the first in the area to embrace this concept," said Monica Tierney, Director of Parks and Recreation. "At first when this was brought up by the Environmental Advisory Board I was skeptical. After doing research and vetting the program against other city, municipal and state programs who have adopted a similar concept, it made more and more sense."

The Pathway to Zero Waste concept came after a couple of years of discussion about a more aggressive recycle program in the parks. It was determined that the implementation of such a program would be upward of \$200,000 in additional manpower to sort and ensure contaminants weren't in the waste. The plan eventually was recommended to the Board of Supervisors by both the Environmental Advisory Board, and the Park and Recreation Board. It received a unanimous vote by the Board of Supervisors.

"Zero Waste seemed unachievable during initial conversation with the Environmental Advisory Board, so the name of the plan was selected very carefully," Tierney added. "In the end, this plan creates a conduit to long term change taking small manageable steps, and overall long-term behavior change."

This plan will be reviewed on a schedule and updated with new objectives on a fluid basis to ensure the Township continues to be a local pioneer in the reduction of waste in our landfills.

FIRE SERVICES

In another month or so the Yardley-Makefield Fire Company will be accepting delivery of our new 2023 Pierce Engine which will be responding from the Woodside Station on Stony Hill Road. This apparatus replaces the 2010 Pierce Engine

which was sold to a company in Virginia. The truck was ordered in September 2021 but due to supply chain demand and the shortage of materials this took longer than usual to build. Moving forward fire companies must plan 3-4 years out from order placement to receiving the apparatus. This isn't the only thing in the fire service that is taking longer to get; our personal protective equipment that protects us at emergencies, use to take 3-6 weeks to receive now takes 9-12 months to receive. Fire Hose takes 6-8 months, batteries for hand lights and rescue tools take 6-10 weeks and portable radios take 16-20 weeks to receive. All this has changed the way the fire company orders items so that no services are impacted.

Spring is in the air and that means lots of outdoor activities, cookouts, sudden severe weather and of course fireworks! Enjoying the outside is essential to our health and well being but we also must be safe while doing it. Below are some helpful hints for keeping safe while being involved with these spring/summer activities:

Fireworks are often used to mark special events and holidays. The only safe way to view fireworks is to attend a professional show. It is important to know that fireworks are not safe in the hands of consumers. Fireworks cause thousands of injuries each year.

Fireworks started an estimated 19,500 fires in 2022, including 1,900 structure fires, 500 vehicle fires, and 17,100 outside and other fires. These fires caused five deaths, 46 civilian injuries, and \$105 million in direct property damage.

In 2022, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 9,100 people for fireworks related injuries; half of those injuries were to the extremities and 34% were to the eye or other parts of the head. Children younger than 15 years of age accounted for more than one-third (36%) of the estimated 2022 injuries.

Sparklers are legal for private use; however, children should never play with them. Sparklers appear safe but can burn as hot as 1,200 to 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit. They can easily ignite clothing and cause severe burning.


If you choose to use legal fireworks, please follow the tips below:

- Never allow young children to handle fireworks.
- Older children should use them only under close adult supervision.
- Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol.
- Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eyewear.
- Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands.
- Never light them indoors.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting.
- Never ignite devices in a container.
- Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks.
- Soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding.
- Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire.
- Never use illegal fireworks.
- Cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- Cannot be discharged from or directed at a building or vehicle.
- Cannot be discharged within 150 feet of a building or vehicle regardless of if the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the consumer fireworks.

Lower Makefield Township Board of Supervisors awarded the contract to develop a Master Plan for Patterson Farm to Seiler + Drury Architects at their meeting on February 15, 2023. This plan will aim to ensure the long-term sustainability and protection of this cherished agricultural resource.



The goal is to work together as a community to identify the best strategies for managing the farm, while preserving its unique character and heritage. Through a collaborative planning process, we will seek input from farmers, residents, businesses, and other stakeholders to help shape the future of this important piece of land.

The Master Plan will include recommendations for land use, infrastructure improvements, zoning regulations, and other policies that will help us achieve our goal of preserving the farm for future generations. It will also explore ways to promote sustainable agriculture practices, protect natural resources, and enhance the economic viability of the farm.

The Township invites all interested parties to participate in this planning process by attending public meetings, providing feedback, and sharing their ideas for the farm's future. Together, we can ensure that this valuable resource remains a vital part of our community for years to come.



Rentals are \$15/hour plus a refundable \$50 security deposit check to hold the reservation. Reservations can be made online using your Community Pass account.



Macclesfield Park Master Plan

Lower Makefield Township recently adopted a new Parks and Recreation Play for All Master Plan and part of the plan is the rehabilitation of Macclesfield Park due to its high traffic, congestion, and overuse. The intent of this work will be to study and address the issues within Macclesfield Park and to create a plan moving forward that meets the needs of our sports groups and the community.

The Board of Supervisors selected Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. (JMT) for this project. JMT is equipped with highly trained and specialized professionals to study site capacity, proper parking, and circulation for optimal use, ball field revitalization, and support facilities to include pavilions, other recreation amenities, restrooms, and lighting.

The purpose of this would be to devise solutions for community and league needs for ball fields and support facilities such as parking circulation. In the end, the master development plan should determine the capacity of the site for ballfields, parking, and circulation and recommendations should be made for improving the park for sports leagues, and park use during the non-organized hours.


