



Jeanne has sent articles to Yardley News, Courier Times, Yardley Voice and the Trend; Ginni suggested it might be a good idea to follow up with the papers. Jeanne will write a blurb to be shown on the Township channel, and will check with Adrienne to see if there are ways to enhance our message and if it is possible for us to televise the program for two months. The blurb will also be sent to local papers for their calendar sections.

The LMT police will add info on the event to the neighborhood watch web site.

Sue will send the flyer to the CTC, who will then send it to everyone on their e-mail lists. She will also distribute copies of the flyer to the schools; Art, Dick and Scott will distribute the remaining 400 to stores, offices, etc. The flyers for Scott and Art should be ready on Thursday; Sue will distribute to Scott.

Newsletter – The LMT Newsletter will be distributed at the end of the October or beginning of November, more than likely too late for the CTC to advertise the Event. However, a shortened version of the article sent to the papers will be submitted to Connie Gruen for the newsletter.

Other –

Art will contact Starbucks re donating the coffee.

Jeanne will talk to Dave about the availability of a warning flag on screen before the video is shown, since it has graphic footage.

Agenda – Sue will do an agenda of the program and distribute it for our review. In addition, she will do a separate agenda with cues for the Commission only.

Ginni spoke about a company that provides a program template on-line and will print the programs for 50 cents each; the Commission members agreed that Ginni should move forward on this. Sue will send Ginni info on Lizette that can be included in the program by the beginning of next week; Jeanne will forward info on herself.

The CTC banner will be hung on the table with the handouts.

The only video confirmed is *Familiar Faces*. Sue will ask Phil Berardelli if he has an appropriate video; Scott will continue to try to get the one from Wales that he saw on You Tube.

Scott is working on finding a driving game that will provide the teens opportunities to try distracted driving. He will have it pulled together by the beginning of October. Then Sue will meet with the police regarding the game and how the goggles will work.

New Business – Jeanne will write articles for the LMT newsletter highlighting CTC accomplishments and tips on reducing deer/car collisions and send it to the CTC for review.

Ginni suggested that the CTC might want to work toward institutionalizing their role in the planning and land development process by establishing a relationship with the Planning Commission. This could allow the CTC to provide input on land use applications earlier in the process. It was agreed that the Commission would discuss this idea further at the CTC November meeting.

With no further business to discuss, the September 21, 2009 meeting of the Citizens Traffic Commission was adjourned at 10:05PM. The next meeting will be held on Monday, October 19, 2009, at 7:30PM, at the LMT Municipal Building.
