Recycling Update/Soccer Tournament – Mr. Dresser will contact Mrs. Liney since the soccer tournament will be held soon. Mr. Maloney mentioned that Mrs. Liney has coordinating recycling at the tournament on her list of things to do.

Land Reviews –

Freemans Farm – The ACOE wetlands determination has still not been received.

Aria Hospital – Aria will meet with the Zoning Commission on October 18; Mr. Dresser suggested that the EAC wait until after that to invite Aria to one of their meetings.

Gatherings – Mr. Dresser reported that nothing has been heard about Gatherings.

CVS/Regency – Mr. Goll reported there are still stormwater problems on the property and expressed concern that the builders were punching holes in the liners as a way to get rid of the water. Mr. Maloney explained that Mr. Majewski had said that was a temporary step so the water wouldn't collect. Mr. Maloney also pointed out that the funds have not been released yet.

Flowers Field – Mr. Dresser was at the Planning Commission September meeting, since Flowers Field was on the agenda. The Planning Commission approved the Flowers Field plan, with riders. Mr. Dresser had concerns about the plan, in the areas of green space, tree replacement, and stormwater management. Mr. Maloney recommended that Mr. Dresser make the argument, when Flowers Field comes up before the Board of Supervisors, that the approved plan has not been thoroughly reviewed. He also suggested that Mr. Dresser ask Mr. Majewski why he thinks the plan is a good one.

Miscellaneous Items –

Open Space - Mr. Bray and Mr. Dresser will ask Mr. Fedorchak, in their meeting with him, what the status is of the assessments to be done on the Ragan property.

Eagle Scout Project – Mr. Dresser reported that he signed off on the project, which is collecting tires from the Delaware River.

Lower Southampton EAC - Mr. Goll met with a member of the Lower Southampton EAC to provide information on LMT's stormwater initiatives. Mr. Bray added that there are power points available, if the LS EAC is interested.

Open Discussion –

Mr. Dresser offered information on an upcoming Heritage Conservancy lecture on stormwater management. He, Mr. Bray and Mrs. Stringer plan to attend.

Mr. Roden spoke of Marcellus Shale conferences and rallies the previous week and recommended a November 2009 article on sustainable energy, which is in Scientific American.

With no further business to discuss, the September 14, 2011 meeting of the Environmental Advisory Council adjourned at 9:15PM. The next meeting of the EAC will be held on Wednesday, October 12, at 7:30PM, in the LMT municipal building.
