



WELCOME OFFICER JUDGE, THE NEWEST ADDITION TO THE LMTPD

This Lower Makefield Township Police Department would like to welcome "Judge" as the newest member of the Canine Unit. Judge is a 2-year-old Belgian Malinois and came from a canine vendor in Connecticut.

The acquisition was made possible due to a generous donation from Jim McCaffrey of McCaffrey Supermarkets. The donation was administered through "The Hometown Foundation Inc.". The foundation supports animal welfare, emergency response personnel, individuals with disabilities or in need, major illness, and military personnel.

Officer Steve Tamburo has been selected as Judge's handler. Both will go through extensive training at the Philadelphia Police Canine Training Academy. Judge is currently being trained in locating missing persons, protection, apprehension, and evidence and property

recovery techniques. Once complete, the team will move onto narcotics detection certification. The team will start patrolling once training is completed in April 2023.

FIRE SERVICES

On December 7, 2022, Firefighters Jennifer Boxer, MacKennzie Crain, Theo Fiori, and Laurie Stiles completed the fall semester 192-hour Firefighter 1 national certification course instructed by the Bucks County Community College. These 4 members put in numerous hours beyond the course studying and practicing hands on skills. We are extremely proud of these members and encourage them to continue to grow and learn in the fire service! We currently have members attending the spring semester Firefighter 1 course and look forward to them completing the course and continuing to serve the community.

The fire company responded to over 650 calls for service in 2022, varying from house fires, vehicle fires, hazardous conditions, and many other emergencies that the company members handled. This number of calls for service has grown over the years from the expanding growth our community is having. Community growth is great, but it also puts a toll on the emergency responders that protect the town. Electric Bicycles and Scooters Fire Safety Tips:

Electric bicycles and electric scooters, or e-bikes and e-scooters, are more popular than ever. These devices give riders a lower-cost and environmentally friendly way of getting around. But, unknown to many users, the batteries that power e-bikes and e-scooters have also been known to catch on fire and cause explosions.

What are e-bikes?

E-bikes and e-scooters are technically known as "motorized micro mobility devices." They are powered by electricity, which is usually provided by a lithium-ion battery. E-bikes can have a motor that either fully propels the vehicle or assists the rider with pedaling.

Do e-bikes catch on fire?

Most e-bikes and e-scooters are powered by lithium-ion batteries. This is the same type of battery that powers many of today's electric vehicles, cell phones, laptops, and power tools. When lithium-ion batteries are damaged, they can overheat, catch on fire, and even lead to explosions. When fires occur, they also tend to burn very hot and can be difficult for firefighters to extinguish. E-bike and e-scooter battery fires have also been associated with faulty charging equipment, improper charging practices, and overloaded electrical circuits.

How often do fires occur?

While there are no national or international statistics on how often e-bikes or e-scooters catch on fire, it does happen with some regularity—and the numbers are rising. The New York City Fire Department (FDNY) has reported more than 200 such fires in 2022. These fires have led to multiple deaths and dozens of injuries. In 2019, the first year FDNY started tracking e-bike fires, only 13 were reported.

How can you stay safe?

There are a few ways to reduce the risk of fires involving e-bikes and e-scooters. First, if you are looking to buy one of these devices, only purchase ones that are listed by a continued on next page

nationally recognized testing lab and labeled accordingly. If you already own or use a device, don't continue to charge the battery once it's full, never use charging equipment that didn't come with your device, and stop using your device if the battery shows signs of damage, such as an unusual odor or change in color. If your device needs repairs, have them performed by a qualified professional.

Acceptable yard waste: wood, grass clippings, tree limbs and leaves. Please cut limbs down to 6' lengths. If you are planning on bringing in large diameter logs (over 36") please call ahead.

Not acceptable yard waste: pressure treated lumber; root balls; wood coated in creosote; bamboo; ornamental grasses; anything with dirt; appliances; tires; concrete; asphalt; stone; furniture; electronics; wood with spikes, nails or other hardware. No bagged material is permitted in the yard.

Any loads with unacceptable materials will not be permitted to enter the yard.

What to expect during the Yard Waste Drop-off Day

The Lower Makefield Township yard waste drop-off site will be open several days throughout the year for LMT residents to use. A contractor working on behalf of a LMT resident can also visit the site.

- We will have an employee looking in the beds/backs of vehicles to ensure only yard waste is coming into the yard. They will also record license plate numbers so we can keep track of number of users and repeat visitors. You will also need to show your ID with your address to verify place of residence.
- The number of vehicles permitted down in the yard at one time in order to manage "traffic" in the yard.
- We will have employees in the yard to direct traffic where the vehicles are to drop off yard waste.
- We will have another employee operating the front loader to push the pile as it gets larger. This will help ensure an orderly process of where vehicles are dumping.
- Any vehicles with items not permitted will not be allowed into the yard to dump.





MACCLESFIELD PARK STUDY

Lower Makefield Township recently adopted a new Parks and Recreation Play for All Master Plan and part of the plan is the rehabilitation of Macclesfield Park due to its high traffic, congestion, and overuse. The intent of this work will be to study and address the issues within Macclesfield Park and to create a plan moving forward that meets the needs of our sports groups and the community.

Now that the use of the park has greatly increased and the demand for space is greater than ever it is important to reevaluate. The use and layout of the park for the optimal user experience for user groups, neighbors, and park goers.

The Board of Supervisors selected Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. (JMT) for this project. JMT is equipped with highly trained and

specialized professionals to study site capacity, proper parking and circulation for optimal use, ball field revitalization and support facilities to include pavilions, other recreation amenities, restrooms, and lighting.

The purpose of this would be to devise solutions for community and league needs for ball fields and support facilities such as parking circulation. In the end the master development plan should determine the capacity of the site for ballfields, parking, and circulation. The recommendations should be made for improving the park for sports leagues, and park use during the non-organized hours.

New in 2023

Implementing Pathway to Zero Waste Plan in the Parks

Over the past few years, the Environmental Advisory Council and the Parks and Recreation Department, and Parks and Recreation Board have been working together to develop a plan to reduce waste within the Township. After years of discussion and final approval by the Board of Supervisors the plan is ready for implementation.

The Pathway to Zero Waste is just a start to a long-term commitment to reduce waste in the Landfills. This will mean that residents can expect their park experience to be a little different as the Township starts to implement the new plan.

Part of this plan to reduce waste in the Township is a new **Carry in Carry Out policy** within the Parks. The Carry in Carry Out model will be phased in through 2023/2024. Park users will be encouraged through signage to be responsible for any waste they bring into the facility. Most parks will go to a strictly Carry in Carry Out model meaning that waste receptacles will be removed from the facility. Park users will instead remove their personal waste and be encouraged to practice recycling in their everyday lives. This program will not only be environmentally responsible, but it will also allow the Department to reallocate staff resources towards other projects.

ART IN THE PARKS

In 2022 the Community Needs Assessment identified that there is a need for more Arts and Culture in the Parks and was added to the Play for all Plan as an area to address. As a follow up Artist of Yardley and the Parks and Recreation Department put their heads together to find a way to imbed Art within the Parks. After reaching out to Seward Johnson Atilier located next to the Grounds for Sculpture, we identified a project partner that would allow the Township to host sculptures for a sixmonth period within the parks. The theme of the project is the vision of the Parks Department "Play for All." Artist of Yardley committed \$5,000 to the project, the Township committed \$5,000 to the project and recently Visit Bucks County Granted the Artist of Yardley an additional \$7,500 for this project. This will allow the Township and the Artist of Yardley to imbed 8 to 10 sculptures throughout the parks and implement programming that encompasses all forms of art to include visual and performing arts. Key Fobs and Pictures




