Crayon Quilts Comes to Lower Makefield Township

The program provides quilts for first responders to give to children whom they come upon in a difficult situation. It's a way to help kids going through a tough time. The quilts feature words of encouragement sewn in with beautiful fabric squares of art work created by children for children.

"What a wonderful way to help children in distress as well as a great opportunity to teach other children the importance of giving" said Chief Ken Coluzzi. "Police officers can also benefit by knowing they are comforting a child and lessening their fear. I am proud to become part of this program."

Founded thirty years ago, Newtown Quilters' Guild provides a welcoming community for quilters, bringing together many diverse interests through a shared love of their art. The guild holds monthly meetings at the Lower Makefield Township Community Center, on the third Tuesday of every month. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. and feature either a guest speaker or a program and an opportunity for quilters to show their work. PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Snow and Ice Removal

With the onset of the winter season, please keep in mind the following information. If there are more than 2 inches of snow on the ground, or if there's a snow emergency, move cars off the street, and pull trashcans from the curbs to make room for the snowplows. Do not shovel snow from the driveway or sidewalk into the street while plows are running. In order to reduce risk of a plow hitting your mailbox, place reflective material prominently on the box.

Clear snow from your front doors if you need to make a quick exit – for instance, in case of a fire. Shovel around your fire hydrants so they're visible and accessible from the street by fire rescue personnel. The house you save could be your own.

Those with special needs or those experiencing personal emergencies, do not hesitate to call 911.

Within 24 hours after snowfall – if feasible, walks should be shoveled for safety of pedestrians. If ice does not permit removal, scatter salt or sand as necessary.

Township salting operations begin on primary highways as soon as snow or freezing rain starts to fall. Plowing begins after 2 to 3 inches accumulates. After primary routes are clear, plows proceed to secondary streets.

Stick to main thoroughfares whenever possible


Maintain a safe distance from snow removal equipment.

Don't use high beams on headlights when driving behind snow equipment since the reflected light can hinder the driver's vision.

If possible, park cars in driveways during inclement weather to allow curb-to-curb plowing. Clear all sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours after precipitation ends. Snow may NOT be piled onto fire hydrants or onto streets. The pathway must be at least 24 inches wide and must include access to the street. Notice to all Lenders, Realtors, Builders, & Property Owners


In accordance with Federal Emergency Management Agency requirements, Lower Makefield Township provides assistance in helping you determine whether parcels located in the Township are affected by floodplains. You should consider taking advantage of this service prior to offering any property for sale or for construction.

The **FEMA Flood Map Service Center (MSC)** Search by Address feature enables you to enter an address, a place, or a set of longitude/latitude coordinates to find the effective flood map for that location.

After locating the flood map, you can view or download it, as well as view or download any Letters of Map Change (LOMC) issued for that flood map. You can quickly assess your flood risk using these online tools.

Home Improvement Contractors (Registration):

On July 1, 2009, the Home Improvement Consumer Protection Act (Senate Bill 100) took effect. This law requires most home improvement contractors to register with the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office. Additionally, these contractors must maintain minimum insurance coverage and utilize contracts that comply with a number of consumer protection requirements specified in this law. The Attorney General's Bureau of Consumer Protection is responsible for enforcement of these requirements.

No home improvement contract shall be valid unless it:

Is in writing, legible and contains the home improvement contractor registration number of the performing contractor.

Is signed by the owner, his agent or other contracted party and the contractor or a salesperson on behalf of the contractor.

Contains the entire agreement between owner and contractor, including attached copies of all required notices.

Contains the date of the transaction.

Contains the name, address and telephone number of the contractor. Note: A post office box number alone shall not be considered an address.

Contains the approximate start and completion date.

Includes a description of the work to be performed, materials to be used and a set of specifications that cannot be changed without a written change order signed by the owner and contractor.

Includes the total sales price due under the contract.

Includes the amount of any down payment plus any amount advanced for the purchase of special order materials. The amount of the down payment and the cost of the special order materials must be listed separately.

Includes the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all subcontractors on the project known at the date of signing the contract. Note: A post office box number alone shall not be considered an address.

The contractor agrees to maintain liability insurance covering personal injury in an amount not less than \$50,000 and insurance covering property damage caused by the work of the home improvement contractor in an amount not less than \$50,000 and identifies the current amount of insurance coverage maintained at the time of signing the contract.

Includes the toll-free telephone number (888-520-6680) of the Office of the Attorney General's public access number to obtain information as to whether a contractor is registered with the bureau as well as information that may be obtained on the bureau's website:

Includes a notice of the Right of Rescission i.e.: a. "An individual signing a home improvement contract, except as provided in the emergency provision noted in the act shall be permitted to rescind the contract without penalty regardless of where the contract was signed, within three business days of the date of signing."

Sanitary Sewer Lateral Inspection Ordinance

Lower Makefield Township adopted Resolution No. 421 at the December 4, 2019 Board of Supervisors meeting requiring the inspection and, if necessary, repair of private sanitary sewer laterals prior to the sale/transfer of residential properties.

What is the Purpose of this Ordinance?

Reduce inflow and infiltration into the public sanitary sewer system.

Almost 50% of the total linear feet of the overall sanitary sewer system are privately owned laterals.

Single most effective method of reducing wastewater flows and key to long term success of effectively managing costs to residents.

Reduce treatment costs passed onto the Township.

Reduce capital expenses associated with capacity upgrades to existing pump stations.

What does the Ordinance Require?

The Lateral Ordinance requires a video inspection of the sanitary sewer lateral from the building to the Township-owned portion of the lateral, and visual inspection of buildings, vents, and cleanouts. The property owner will be responsible for correcting or repairing any deficiencies & providing a video documentation of the repair. Upon review and approval by Lower Makefield Township, a permit will be issued.

The approval of the permit is required prior to the transfer of any property in Lower Makefield Township that is currently connected to the public sanitary sewer system.

When are Inspections Required?


Upon the sale or transfer of residential properties,

Based on a 10-year schedule for all non-residential properties, apartment complex containing 4 or more units and common laterals where more than one housing unit is connected

When the Township intends to repair or replace a conveyance line; or

Upon inspection of the sanitary sewer system by the Township, its personnel, or it's authorized agent(s) that discovers a sanitary sewer lateral that is not in compliance.

Director's Update

LMT Residents.

In 2019, the Lower Makefield Township Parks and Recreation Department continued with past traditions while adding new elements. We added Camp LMT for the first time to our offerings. We hosted 60 campers weekly at the Community Center, we went on trips to the Philadelphia Zoo, Sesame Place, Funzilla, the New Jersey State Museum, The Crayola Factory, and more. We had visitors from Mad Science, the Bucks County Free Library – Yardley branch, Super Soccer Stars, and Young Rembrandts. We also explored 5-Mile Woods and the Pool at LMT.

Also new this year: we hosted our first Dog Park Howl-O-Ween Event and our first Monster Mash at the Community Center. The Parks and Recreation Department also worked closely with the Environmental Advisory Council to install trees at the Caiola Field. Over 60 people came out from varying organizations to volunteer their time to plant 123 trees and shrubs in one day. Looking forward to more volunteer opportunities this year.

We continue to grow in our department; we will be hiring a new laborer in April to help maintain our new infrastructure and growing needs. We will be replacing shrubs at the Garden of Reflection, completing the Memorial Park Expansion Project, installing and repairing bike paths, installing new shingles on the pavilions and refinishing the bathrooms in The POOL. We will continue to offer a variety of programming. One of the new additions is the addition of a tween camp at The POOL called Camp Good Vibes for tweens ages 11-14. This camp is for pool members and will include weekly trips and activities.

Heading into the new year, the Parks and Recreation Department will continue to improve and hold ourselves to even higher standards than ever before. It is our goal to spend 2020 formalizing some of our processes, improving some of our policies and procedures, creating an organization

chart, creating measurable goals and objectives for the department and providing a dashboard for the community with important annual participation information.

After extensive conversations with the staff and the Township Manager, and also presenting to the Parks and Recreation Board, we have developed a new mission and vision specific to the Parks and Recreation Department. The new departmental vision and mission aligns better with the new Township Comprehensive Plan, which was adopted in August 7, 2019, and the National Recreation and Parks Association's standards (NRPA). The mission is broken into three pillars: Health, Environment and Community.



Old Mission: It is the mission of the Park and Recreation Board to plan the orderly development and use of the township parks and recreational facilities for Lower Makefield Township sanctioned organizations and individuals for non-profit recreational purposes. The use of these public facilities will be made in a non-discriminatory fashion with the intention of promoting participation for all residents of Lower Makefield Township subject to the rules and regulations set forth in the Park and Recreation policy statement.

New Vision: Cultivating health, happiness and community

New Mission:

HEALTH: Improve physical health, mental health and overall quality of life by offering safe and accessible facilities and open space.

ENVIRONMENT: Act as environmental stewards through responsible use of the natural environment and protect and maintain Parks and Recreation assets.

COMMUNITY: Create opportunities for the community to connect through a wide variety of partnerships, programs, events and classes.

Finally, the Parks and Recreation Department will be pursuing the CAPRA (Commission for Accreditation of Parks and Recreation Agencies) which will further enhance the services we offer the Township. This is a multi-year process that will help hold us accountable as a Township and will ensure that we are operating with the best practices.

We look forward to engaging the community and staff as we enter this new decade.

TYPE	MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS
Family	Husband, wife, domestic partners; unmarried dependent children 25 years of age and under, and parents/grandparents who reside at the same LMT address on a permanent basis.
Individual	One person who resides in LMT on a permanent basis. Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult.
Senior Individual	One person, age 62 (born before 9/7/58) or older who resides in LMT on a permanent basis. Full season individual membership privileges.
Senior Limited	One person, age 62 (born before 9/7/58) or older who resides in LMT on a permanent basis. The facility can only be used from 4:00 p.m. until closing. This membership is allowed one guest per evening, regardless of age, subject to the guest fee.
Non-Resident Family	Husband, wife, domestic partners; unmarried dependent children 25 years of age and under, and parents/grandparents who reside at the same address on a permanent basis and are sponsored by a paid LMT pool member or Township official. Please contact the office for details.
Non-Resident Individual	One person. Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult. Must be sponsored by a paid LMT pool member or Township official. Please contact the office for details.
August	Valid from August 1 through Labor Day and are subject to the same conditions and privileges as full-season memberships but are not eligible for swim team. Available to residents and non-residents.
Caregiver	Not included in the Family Membership fee but is registered under your family membership as a non-family member. Caregivers have no membership privileges; cannot go to The Pool Complex on their own; and cannot bring in any guests. The Caregiver must be 16 years of age or older.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

To process your registration and activate your account, for same day entry, your information must be received in person at the Township building by 11:00 AM. Pictures will then be taken and Key Fobs issued.

Refund Policy – Requests must be received in writing and key fobs returned to the Township Building by Friday, May 22, 2020. Refunds will not be issued after this date.

Change of Membership – There is an administrative service charge of \$25.00 for switching membership categories. This is in addition to the fee required for the new category of membership.

Returned Check Fee - There is a \$15.00 return check charge.

Lost Key Fob - Replacement fee is \$5.00 per key fob. Please contact the office immediately if key fob is lost so it can be deactivated.

Swim Lesson Registration for Pool Members - Class Information and Online Registration will be available in June.

Swim and Dive Team – Swim/Dive Team memberships are available to any child with an active pool membership. Additional information is available at www.lmtswim.com.







