



WHAT ARE THEY BUILDING NOW?

There has been lots of buzz around development and new construction projects in the Township. Some of the larger projects include:

Prickett Preserve at Edgewood on Stony Hill Road across from Shady Brook Farm is projected to break ground this Spring 2022. The mixed-use development will include a Wegmans, a bank, a pharmacy, an existing historic farmhouse & barn that will be preserved & repurposed, 200 apartment units with a pool & clubhouse, and several retail/restaurant commercial buildings. Traffic improvements will include an additional travel lane between Lindenhurst Road and I-295, ramp realignment at I-295 WB/Route 332, dual left turn lanes from Route 332 onto Stony Hill Road, a traffic signal at Shady Brook Farm & a pedestrian path on Stony Hill Road into Edgewood Village.



Regency at Yardley Carriages, a 186-unit 55+ townhouse community on Big Oak Road, is currently under construction. **Reserve at Manor Lane**, an 11-unit single-family attached townhouse dwelling community on Sutphin Road, is currently under construction.

Yardley Preserve, a 76-unit 55+ townhouse community on Dobry Road, is currently under construction.

Pennsylvania American Water Company is nearing completion on \$24 million in safety & water quality improvements in Lower Makefield to provide reliable water service for area customers. Projects include the Yardley Treatment Plant on Edgewood Road, Quarry Road Booster Pump Station, and the Oxford Valley Road Booster Pump Station.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

1. Are you planning to remodel or make improvements to your home or property?

A permit is always required for **any addition or structural modification to your existing living space.** Permits are required for electrical modifications, plumbing work, window & door modifications that enlarge openings, mechanical system installations, pools, patios, decks, fences, sheds, & driveway expansions.

Permits are **not** required for: painting, flooring, gutters, downspouts, & other cosmetic improvements, plus replacements for a single-family residential roof, vinyl siding replacement, replacement windows, and replacement doors provided there are no structural changes or changes in framing.

If you are a do-it-yourselfer or a new contractor in Lower Makefield, be sure to review our <u>General Instructions for Permits</u> (https://www.lmt.org) for the sections relevant to your project. If you still have questions, you can stop in or email us at permits@lmt.org for assistance.

Lower Makefield Township has adopted the PA Uniform Construction Code (UCC). These codes are scheduled to be updated early in 2022.

2. What size should my house number be?

Emergency responders need to see your address clearly from the street. Residential house numbers must be at least six (6) inches tall and be of a color visible from the street.

3. Can someone in the Township help me with questions on flooding and insurance?

Lower Makefield Township provides assistance to all property owners, lenders, realtors, and builders through the following services:

- Help you determine whether parcels located in the Township are affected by floodplains
- Review flood maps and other information
- Provide Elevation Certificate, flood depth and property data
- Answer questions about flood insurance
- Conduct site visits to assist with localized flooding issues
- Answer questions about building projects in the floodplain

FEMA is updating the National Flood Insurance Program's (NFIP) risk rating methodology through the implementation of a new pricing methodology called Risk Rating 2.0. The methodology leverages industry best practices and cutting-edge technology to enable FEMA to deliver rates that are actuarily sound, equitable, easier to understand and better reflect a property's flood risk. NFIP policyholders can contact their insurance company or insurance agent to learn more about what Risk Rating 2.0-Equity in Action means to them.

PUBLIC WORKS: SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

With the onset of the winter season, please keep in mind the following information. If there are more than 2 inches of snow on the ground, or if there's a snow emergency, move cars off the street, and pull trashcans from the curbs to make room for the snowplows. Do not shovel snow from the driveway or sidewalk into the street while plows are running. In order to reduce risk of a plow hitting your mailbox, place reflective material prominently on the box.

Clear snow from your front doors if you need to make a quick exit – for instance, in case of a fire. Shovel around your fire hydrants so they're visible and accessible from the street by fire rescue personnel. The house you save could be your own.

Those with special needs or those experiencing personal emergencies, do not hesitate to call 911. Within 24 hours after snowfall – if feasible, walks should be shoveled for safety of pedestrians. If ice does not permit removal, scatter salt or sand as necessary.

Township salting operations begin on primary highways as soon as snow or freezing rain starts to fall. Plowing begins after 2 to 3 inches accumulates. After primary routes are clear, plows proceed to secondary streets.

- Stick to main thoroughfares whenever possible
- Maintain a safe distance from snow removal equipment.
- Don't use high beams on headlights when driving behind snow equipment since the reflected light can hinder the driver's vision.
- If possible, park cars in driveways during inclement weather to allow curb-to-curb plowing.
- Clear all sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours after precipitation ends. Snow may NOT be piled onto fire hydrants or onto streets. The pathway must be at least 24 inches wide and must include access to the street. See "Snow and Ice Removal Requirements" below for complete details.

With 28 miles of bike trails that connect parks, sports fields, the 5-Mile Woods Preserve, the 9/11 Memorial Garden of Reflection, The LMT Pool, and the Dog Park,

The Lower Makefield Township Parks and Recreation Department is located at the Community Center and is open to the public, Monday-Friday from 9am-3pm, field or pavilion rental requests, and to sign up for programs like the ones you will find within this quide.



Park Pavilion Permit Requests

There are two pavilions available for private parties and events. Kid's Kingdom at Community Park has a covered pavilion with capacity for 30 people. Memorial Park has a covered pavilion next to the Secret Garden Playground with capacity for 20 people. Both pavilions have *bathroom, playground, grilling, and picnic table access. Rentals are \$15/hour plus a refundable \$50 security deposit check to hold the reservation. Reservations can be made online using your Community Pass account.

SUMMER HIRING WITH BETTER WAGES

In 2021, we experienced significant staffing issues at the Pool and within our Summer Camp due to increased competition for young employees. Young employees can work in a variety of businesses with higher wages, and where the lives of the patrons do not count on their abilities. To mitigate the staffing issues this year, the Township has elected to raise temporary summer staff wages as part of the budget processes. New applicants and returning employees will see a pay increase in the range of \$9.50HR to \$14.50HR depending on the position. This is a big improvement from the previous wage range of \$8.25HR to \$11.25HR.

If you intend on applying for the Pool or Camp LMT now is the time to do so.

- Assistant Managers
- Lifeguards
- Maintenance Staff (14+)
- Gate Attendants (18+).
- Summer Camp Staff (16+)

WHAT IS NEW AT THE POOL

This year will mark the 41st season for the Pool at LMT! We invite returning and new members to take advantage of our new 'a la carte' membership options to enjoy our first-rate amenities.

The reason for the change is twofold:

- 1) We need to pay staff more to remain a competitive employer in todays market
- 2) We need to accommodate modern families with modern family dynamics.

This is something that has been contemplated for a while as we receive a significant amount of feedback from residents and potential members with different family circumstances. Overall, fees are still increasing but not across the board. The new model will be more of an "a la cart" menu where members will pay by user.

This model equally distributes rates based on different

family structures and member circumstances.

Over the years, single parent/one child households were paying the same rate as a larger family of five people. In the new model, single parent one child households will be pay a lower rate, while families of 5 will be pay a higher rate as they have a greater number of people using the facility.

The Lower Makefield Township Pool is one of the premier Aquatics Complexes in the area boasting 4 heated swimming pools including an Olympic Pool, Lap Pool, Intermediate Pool, Tot Pool. There are also additional amenities including a high dive and two standard diving boards, two amusement slides, and a quality snack bar run by Sicilia Catering.

In addition, we offer special events and water fitness classes at no additional charge.

We look forward to seeing you this summer at the pool.





CAPRA ACCREDITATION PROCESS

In 2019 Lower Makefield Township Parks and Recreation Department applied for the CAPRA (The Commission for Accreditation of Parks and Recreation Agencies) National Accreditation Process. This Accreditation is a quality assurance for the Residents of the Township that will allow the Township to operate more efficiently and effectively through checks and balances. Throughout this process, staff have worked to streamline many of our processes, protect current assets and plan more resourcefully for the future of the Township.

This process has allowed the Parks and Recreation Department to work more efficiently and effectively with the Residents, Elected Officials and Volunteer Boards to improve. To date we have completed the ADA Transition Plan which outlines a way to make the parks more accessible to those of all abilities. We organized a race to raise money for this process and already started transitioning by adding Handicapped Parking to Macclesfield Park and Memorial Park. In addition, we created a Risk Management/Emergency Action Plan for

all of our facilities, developed a Marketing and Community Outreach plan, and outlined how we could better work with volunteers, and created a Maintenance and Operations Plan that will help track all of our maintenance needs.

As we continue improve our processes and complete the CAPRA process one of the things we need to do most is complete a community Needs Assessment, and create a Parks and Recreation Strategic/Master Plan.

This is where we need your help, by the time you read this article we will have completed one of the early phases of the project, a survey that has been sent out to the community through multiple sources. Now we are looking for residents to take part in a community work group to discuss some of the findings and to strategize for the future. The date is set for February 3rd at 7:30PM via zoom. \$25,000! Always putting community 1st!


Family Golf Community Days were held to allow junior golfers to experience just a small piece of what we offer at MHGC.
