Bio for Lower Makefield Township Veterans' Commemorative Ceremony November 6, 2021

Adrian Saguil (Maiden Name Sykes) is a 2001 graduate of the United States Military Academy where she majored in Civil Engineering, graduated in the top 10% of her class, and played Women's Lacrosse. She received her Academy appointment from Senator William Roth in the fall semester of her junior year in high school, gaining early admission and acceptance. Commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant following graduation, Adrian completed Officer Basic Training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri before reporting to her first assignment as Earthmoving Platoon Leader, Alpha Company, 94th Engineer Combat Battalion (Heavy), 130th Engineer Brigade, V Corps, in Hohenfels, Germany.

Lieutenant Saguil led her platoon on a peacekeeping NATO Mission to renovate a portion of a hospital in Drawsko Pomorski, Poland. In 2002, First Lieutenant Sykes moved to Bravo Company and assumed leadership of a vertical construction engineer platoon. Soon after, the unit deployed to Kuwait and she led her platoon during the invasion in March 2003 as direct support to the First Marine Division. Lieutenant Sykes rejoined the battalion at Baghdad Airport as a home base location for all future missions during the deployment.

Lieutenant Saguil was then promoted to Executive Office of the Headquarters and Support Company for the remainder of the deployment, earning the name "Gladiator X." Following a 15-month deployment, the unit returned to Germany and newly-promoted Captain Sykes became the Battalion S-3 Construction Officer. She worked with the local base facilities to secure construction projects for the troops to execute and train. In June 2004, CPT Sykes was tasked with supporting the 60th Anniversary of D Day at Normandy, France.

The 94th Engineers received orders to deploy to Iraq again in January 2005. Having outgrown the unit and subject to a nomovement policy, CPT Sykes was assigned to the 11th Armored Calvary Regiment as the Assistant C-7 to the Multi-National Forces -Iraq (MNF-I) Northern Territory, a senior Major's position. Based out of Mosul, CPT Saguil assisted in the oversight of all engineer assets for Norther Iraq. General David M. Rodriquez, Commander of all Northern Forces in Iraq and a native of Pennsylvania, personally requested CPT Sykes to assume the role of Adjutant, a Lieutenant Colonel's position for the last three months of her deployment. CPT Sykes returned to Germany in January of 2006. In June 2006, CPT Sykes decided to leave the military after completing her commitment to pursue a career in engineering and construction, and to marry her husband Brendon Saguil.

CPT Sykes' awards include the Bronze Star Medal, Army Commendation Medal (Two Awards), Army Achievement Medal (Two Awards), USA Presidential Unit Citation, Meritorious Unit Commendation, National Defense Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) Expeditionary Forces Medal, GWOT Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Ribbon (Two awards), Parachutist Badge (Army and Air Force), German Armed Forces Efficiency Badge- Bronze.

Adrian and Brendon have been residents of Yardley since 2008. Adrian is currently employed with the US Army Corps of Engineers, Philadelphia Office. They have two children - Ella, 10, and Calvin, 8, who attend Makefield Elementary. The family is involved with LMT Pool and Swim Team, YMS Travel Soccer, PAA Baseball and Softball, Holy Trinity Church, and the Yardley VFW. Most people who know Adrian joke that you can tell what season it is by which "coach" jersey she is wearing as she is always volunteering to help with sports.



20 YEARS LATER at the 9-11 Memorial Garden of Reflection



On September 11, 2001 our country was forever changed by a series of unprecedented events. That day 2,973 people were killed in a series of targeted attacks. The World Trade Center in New York City, The Pentagon in Washington DC, and an open field in Somerset County became the battlefields where thousands perished. Thousands of acts of valor followed in response to these despicable acts. Eighteen Bucks County Residents, including 9 Lower Makefield Township residents were lost that day. The 9-11 Memorial Garden of Reflection was created in Memorial Park on Woodside Road to honor those lost and is both a Bucks County and Pennsylvania's Official State 9/11 Memorial. Since its dedication in 2006, this Memorial has been a place of community gathering and healing.

This year marked 20 years since the events of that horrific September day. Lower Makefield Township proudly and humbly hosted several events and activities to remember the victims and offer support to their families and loved ones.

One of the activities in the week prior to September 11th was an opportunity to tour the Oak Garden Arboretum at Memorial Park. Visitors were invited to take a peaceful stroll while learning more about the nine victims from Lower Makefield Township and their lives here in Bucks County. Kiosks with profiles and photos celebrating their lives lined the walkway while giving visitors a unique view of the garden. One of the most powerful images in the aftermath of the attacks were the thousands of messages, photos and flags that became makeshift memorials. In the plaza at the Oak Garden Lower Makefield Township Volunteers developed three, "Walls of Reflection". These walls invited visitors to post messages of remembrance, hope, love and prayer in the same way the communities did so many years ago.

On Friday September 10th, at sunset, the Tribute Flag was hoisted and lowered to halfmast in a small ceremony. The flag remained in the Flag Circle at Memorial Park throughout the weekend. The Tribute Flag is a unique flag as it is the only one in existence that has been flown over all three crash sights as well as The Garden of Reflection. The pilots who participated in this mission were there to bear witness as well as numerous visitors.

On Saturday, September 11th, the focus shifted to the theme of the day, Honor, Reflect and Unite. The day began with a morning memorial ceremony that honored those who lost their lives and to annotate the timeline of the tragic events of the day. Respect was given by ringing of bells and followed by silence. All victims from Pennsylvania had their names read aloud, and the eighteen from Bucks County were honored with flowers that moved from the ceremony area to the inner glass wall of the fountains. In the afternoon,



quiet time for reflection of the day's events saw hundreds of visitors. Pennsbury National Honor Society students were on hand to act as Ambassadors to the garden. They were available to greet visitors, provide tours, and answer questions.



The day was capped off with an uplifting ceremony that was meant to Unite the community, teach us through past experiences and move into the future. The very poignant Remembrance in Light Ceremony was beautifully crafted to bring families and visitors to the garden and symbolically move them through healing and unity. Members of the clergy spoke about faith, and Honored Guests Ben Sliney and Colonel Tom Armas spoke of their experiences and lessons learned from 9/11. "After Darkness ... Light" is the symbolic journey the Garden of Reflection invites you to take, and in true community unity the ceremony ended with all attendees lighting a candle bringing us hope, peace and togetherness.

We would like to thank the countless volunteers who gave of their time and talent to the 20th year remembrance activities.

9/11 "Never Forget" pins will be available for purchase at the Lower Makefield Township Community Center, 1550 Oxford Valley Rd. Yardley PA 19067. These pins are banded with a red commemorative "20" feature. This is the last year these pins will be available. Steven Singer Jewelers contributes the \$10 of the purchase price to the endowment to preserve the memorial in perpetuity.

The "**Remembrance Fund**" endowment will support the maintenance of the memorial in perpetuity. Any donation over \$2,500 will be displayed on Endowment Donor Plaques located in The Garden.

LEAF COLLECTION

Leaf Collection normally begins the first week of November. There are two rounds of pick-ups and the second starts after the first is fully complete. Typically, each round takes about 4 weeks, weather dependent, with the final round usually wrapping up by Christmas. Details and status updates will be posted on the Lower Makefield Township website (www.lmt.org) as well as on TV (Comcast cable channel 22 and Verizon FIOS channel 20).

The Township is broken up into zones and teams are assigned into each zone for leaf collection. Each team is made up of a truck with leaf trailer, a driver, a hose operator and 1-2 rakers. Last year we utilized 7 Township teams plus 3 contractor teams. We employ approximately 20 additional seasonal employees during the fall to round out our teams. It is a large-scale operation which requires detailed planning to execute efficiently.

Each team systematically works through their assigned zone to pick up the leaves on each side of every street with residential properties. As the Public Works Crew works hard to collect the leaves in a timely manner, we want to add a few notes and reminders so we can all help each other in this endeavor:

- Rake leaves curbside for pick-up NOT IN THE STREET. In LMT, it is unlawful to place leaves, materials or substances on any road or highway.
- Leaves must be free of branches, twigs and other debris. These items clog and damage the vacuum hoses on the machines and cost valuable time to repair.
- Leaves in biodegradable bags will be picked up, while leaves in plastic bags will be emptied and the bags left curbside. Plastic bags damage the machines and don't make good compost.
- When it snows, the same equipment and crew used to pick up the leaves is used in snow removal efforts. Even minor overnight snowfall impacts our ability to pickup leaves as the equipment has to be switched back over.









The **FEMA Flood Map Service Center (MSC)** Search by Address feature enables you to enter an address, a place, or a set of longitude/latitude coordinates to find the effective flood map for that location. After locating the flood map, you can view or download it, as well as view or download any Letters of Map Change (LOMC) issued for that flood map. You can quickly assess your flood risk using these online tools. We can assist you with using this service.






