## FACILITIES/PROGRAM UPDATE

Programming: Community Center programming has been constantly growing, changing, and updating since our opening in January. To date, we have had 306 registrants for classes. We have introduced new programming such as summer camps, exercise classes, and art workshops to the community. Beginning in the Fall, we will offer new programs such as support groups, self-defense classes, and Music Together youth music classes. We will also continue with our successful programming from previous seasons. Groups such as the Newtown Quilters Guild, and Philanthropic Educational Organization have regular meetings in our space, and community organizations and residents have rented the community center for school-related projects, meetings, and even a cultural dance. There has been new programming introduced for the entire community. The LMT walking group hosts about one walk per month and has seen as many as 14 people join a walk, and new members are always welcome. Additionally, the community center will be open for "First Fridays". From 6-9pm on the first Friday of each month, all ages are welcome for a few hours of family fun.

**Veterans Park:** The Veterans Park sign has been installed and we will be installing the walkway in the upcoming month.

**Stoddart/Ciaola/Fred Allan:** PAA installed a new batting cage at Fred Allan and fixed the batting cages at Caiola Fields.

**Memorial Park:** Preparation for the 9/11 Ceremonies is in full swing. There will be two Ceremonies this year on 9/11 a morning ceremony at 8:30AM and a candle light vigil at 7:00PM.

**Community Center:** We are in the process of completing audio visual installation in the Great Room, so we will be better equipped for presentations and events. Outdoor seating has been installed and the patio area is open.
