I, S. F. Hanson do hereby certify, that
 I am Captain of Co. "B" of the Second (2d) Regt
 Regiment Pennsylvania Vols., and am acquainted with Moses H.
 Suber late a member of my Company, and an applicant
 for an Invalid Pension. That the said Moses H. Suber was
 mustered into service on or about the 28th day of August
 1861, and discharged for disability about the 21th day of December
 1862, having become disabled from doing duty as a soldier from, on or about the
 28th or 29th day of August 1862, while in the service of
 the United States, and in the line of his duty as a soldier, in the manner and at the
 place as follows: ^{At} the second battle of Bull Run Va. near
 Washington D. C. he was thrown from his horse
 between Leggett Station and Pope's New Station on the O. & A. R.R.
 while on picket service - in the night. He in company
 with one or two others were attacked and retreated -
 the night was very dark and I have no doubt
 the accident was unavoidable - the injury was
 received in the strictest line of duty. His spine was

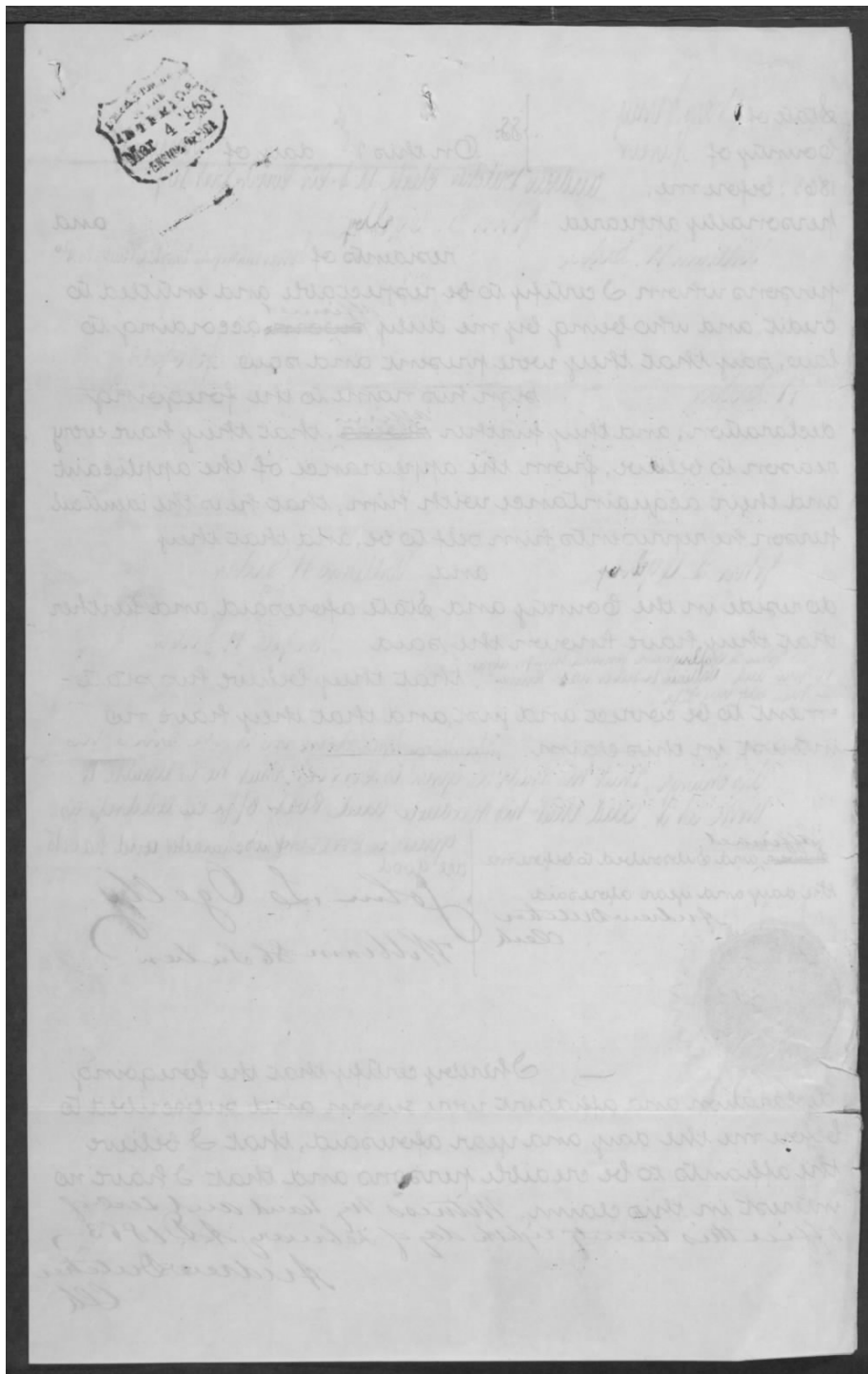

D.C. on account of various diseases of disability and disability

as follows: "Doubtless a deep wound in the right of back, from the fall of
the horse from his back, returning to the station of Christian's Station
Pa. for D.C. &c. That about half of the Co. had been thrown out for being
disabled, and that they were attacked by the enemy with a
sharp fire, and killed, and that in the confusion his
horse became unmanageable, from the fact of the horse being
threw him, and fell down, and when he came back to his feet, that he had no
