PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On July 2, 1776, representatives in Philadelphia decided that thirteen British colonies would be free and independent states. Two days later, on the Fourth of July, the Continental Congress announced their decision to the world through the Declaration of Independence. It was printed that day in John Dunlap's printing office in Philadelphia on poster-sized sheets, to be used at public readings and copied by other printers.

The well-known portion of the Declaration – “We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness” is only a small portion of the preamble of the Declaration. The less well-known body of the Declaration includes a list of twenty-seven grievances against King George's rule over the colonies. Some of these could be considered grievances against today's government.

Although we celebrate July 4th, as the anniversary of the Declaration, the parchment copy that now resides in the National Archives was not created until several weeks later and was not signed until after August 2nd, as the Colonial Delegates returned to Philadelphia to join the Congress. Of the fifty-six signers of the Declaration, nine represented Pennsylvania, the largest contingent of the thirteen colonies.

Many celebrations and special events are scheduled over the next several weeks. Our own special America 250 Celebration on Tuesday June 9th was a tremendous success, thanks to the hard work of Joanne Westall and her dedicated committee. We had over 100 people attending the event. We enjoyed an enlightening presentation about the critical 10 days surrounding Washington's crossing the Delaware, patriotic music selections by the Men of Harmony, and a luncheon of hot dog, pulled pork barbeque, coleslaw, potato salad, chips, and apple cobbler.

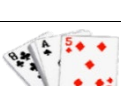

Movie Matinee is taking a summer vacation – back in September.

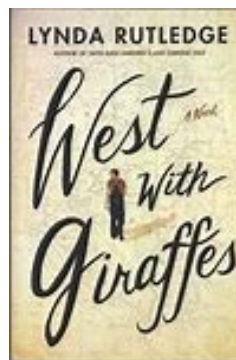

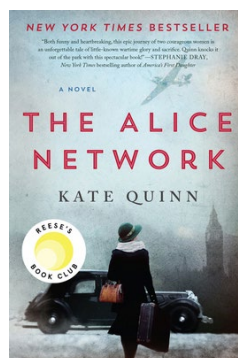
Book Club does not meet in July and August, but plan to join us next on **Wednesday, September 9th** at 12:30PM for interesting and lively discussion. All are welcome!

Makefield Seniors for over 25 years.



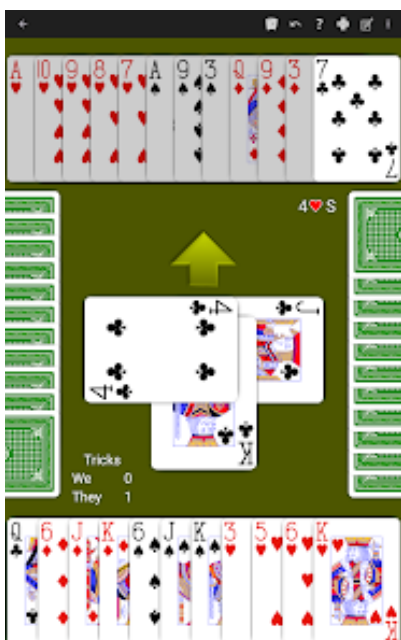

Dave Burkhardt - President



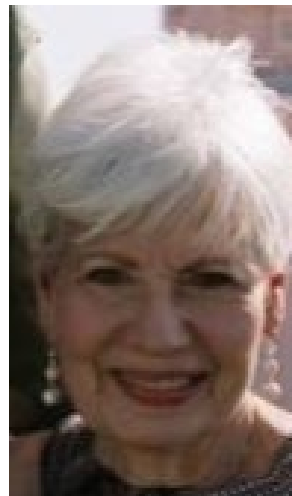

Meryle Boročaner - Vice President

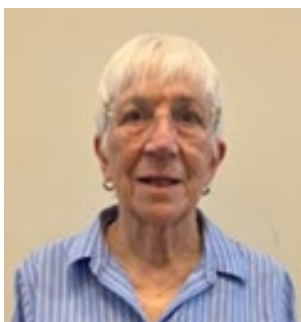
